I was recently approached regarding teaching children animal communication. Since I am, by and large, an adult educator, I was a bit concerned regarding my ability to teach this wonderful subject to children.

But I have realized this about myself ... offer me a challenge and I will go for it.

Sunday the 11th April arrived and at 9am, 8 little people, together with either mums and dads, walked through the door.

I had opened the class to children aged 7 – 13 and despite being warned by my highly experienced Montessori teaching sister, I decided to go ahead. This did create a challenge as I realised that the concentration span of a 7 year old is nowhere near that of a 12 year old.

I had written, what I thought was an age appropriate manual, filled with illustrations and easy to read text. I had to laugh when the dear 7 year old asked me when are we going to start the fun stuff. Illustration filled manuals clearly did not hold the attention of a 7 year old.

I was amazed at the ease at which all the students went into a short meditation to find their animal guide and how beautifully and in such detail they were able to draw their guide.

Our first “client” arrived. This was the sweetest dog named Sandy. The children communicated with her with absolute ease and each and every child came up with a lot of evidential information. After the reading, Sandy went around the room and personally congratulate each student. What further amazed me was how children totally trust their intuition. So unlike their adult counterparts.

The children communicated with live animals and from photos which they shared with one another.

When working in groups of 2, they unashamedly admitted to having some questions “wrong”. Of course they were never “wrong” but at times their interpretation of symbols and messages received were not accurate. This is to be expected from brand new communicators as practice does make perfect.

At some time during the day, my really tidy lounge resembled a popcorn covered child’s playroom. And when I could no longer stand the chaos of popcorn and chips on the floor, I took out the vacuum cleaner and vacuumed the room. No one batted an eyelid, instead they continued with their high level of communication.

When instructed to go out into the garden and speak to a tree or a plant, not one child showed any disbelief in the process. Each child returned with a reading explaining the feelings and needs of the plant or tree they chatted to.

Later in the day when the animal communicators were looking a bit jaded, we did some interesting telepathic exercises. One of the course participants was a sweet little boy; an awesome communicator but also the student to be on the floor throwing popcorn at the ceiling whilst managing really good animal communication. Quiet a lesson to me and something that I teach; be light and joyful. I thoroughly enjoyed the day and apparently so did the children.

A certificate of completion was issued and at 4pm, they left. 7 of them happy and smiling. Only I little girl looked a bit sad about a reading that she received about her missing dog. She was easily placated by her mom and in a short while she too was full of smiles.

As you can imagine, I was in bed by 8pm that evening!

The following day, I lay on the floor whilst doing a reading throwing popcorn towards the ceiling but unfortunately I did not manage to gain the insight that the little student had. Best I stick to sitting on a chair like an adult!
